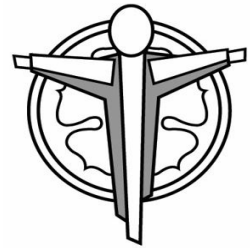

Refugees start their lives over in the U.S. with next to nothing and face the difficult challenge of learning a new culture and language. We can help by providing a care pack of culturally appropriate foods to offer a comforting taste of home to a seven-member Rohingya family expected to arrive on May 18, 2023. There will be a special door collection at all the worship services this weekend.

FEED MY STARVING CHILDREN: The Board of Service Ministry is sponsoring an evening at FEED MY STARVING CHILDREN in Schaumburg on Tuesday, May 9 from 7:00 pm to 8:45 pm. This enjoyable service activity is good for the entire family and creates food packs for starving children in many places around the world. We have openings for 20 people. FOOD PANTRY NEEDS: Thanks to all who donate to the Food Pantry. Items needed are cookies, pancake syrup, meals in a can, such as spaghettiOs, ravioli, hash, canned ham, chunky soups, mac and cheese, grape and strawberry jelly, 1 & 2 lb. bags of rice, brownie mix, cold cereal, toilet paper and paper towels. Unacceptable items are diapers/pampers, and oatmeal products of any kind.

PANTRY NOTICE: Please check expiration dates before bringing them to church. The Food Pantry cannot accept food items with exceeded expiration dates so they will be discarded.

MAKING DONATIONS ELECTRONICALLY: There are two ways to donate to St Andrews electronically - you can use either a smart phone app (VancoMobile) or our website (standrewsparkridge.org). The QR code at the top of the front page will take you directly to the website donation page - no need to enter the URL, and no need to use the "Click HERE to Give" link on that page. Both options allow you to make one time donations or to set up regularly scheduled (weekly or monthly) donations, and to designate the purpose of your donation.

HEARING ASSISTANCE: St Andrews has a system which amplifies the sound of our pastors, musicians and readers. Two types of receivers are available. One type clips to your ear, the second type is a loop that is worn around your neck and feeds the sound directly to your hearing aids (if they have telecoil capability). The receivers are stored on the pulpit, readily available for use. They're very easy to try. If you'd like to check them out, please ask Pastor Matt, Pastor Sam or John Snow for assistance.

What has MYRA been up to? (May 1-10)

Did you know that each Comfort Dog has a Bible verse? Myra's verse is 1 Peter 5:2 "Care for the flock that God has entrusted to you. Watch over it willingly, not grudgingly – not for what you will get out of it, but because you are eager to serve God." Myra has happily taken on this responsibility, bringing joy, comfort and smiles to the faces of everyone she meets during her many visits. In addition to her presence at St. Andrews church services, she is a regular visitor at Central Baptist Village, Amazing Grace Senior Living, Chicago Behavioral Hospital, Emerald Place, Arbor Terrace, The Summit, and Ascension Living Resurrection Village; all of which she visited these past 10 days. She also spent time at National Louis University to provide a comforting distraction as finals were approaching; Great Lakes Naval Base USO at their Pups and Pizza Family Night; Immaculate Conception Grade School greeting the children during their recess; and at Mt. Sinai Hospital visiting with nursing staff. Myra is a busy girl and keeps the handlers and ministry partners quite busy.
