FOOD PANTRY UPDATE: 168 households visited the food pantry at St Paul of the Cross in June. Most needed items are pasta sauce, canned fruit, pancake syrup, ketchup and cooking oils (vegetable, canola, or olive). Thank you for your continuing support!

MISSION OF THE MONTH: The Evangelical Lutheran Church of Brazil, a daughter church of the Lutheran Church—Missouri Synod, is all grown up now. Currently the church numbers 245,631 baptized members served by 862 pastors in 1,505 congregations. Our **Mission to Brazil** efforts are now resulting in the new efforts by IELB to develop its own missionary program based on the LCMS network support model. Our Brazilian partner is now sending missionary pastors to the Republic of Congo, Guatemala, Dominican Republic and Uruguay. It is truly a blessing to have our Brazilian brothers and sisters join us in bringing the Gospel to people who have not yet found the joy of God's love in Christ!

SHARE THE JOY: The Apostle Paul said that he wanted to be all things to all people. By that, he meant that he wanted to speak in ways that were relevant to the people whom he hoped to reach with the Gospel. He met Jews in the synagogues and spoke to them from the Old Testament Scriptures about the Jews' history of faith. However, he had a far different approach when he spoke to the Greeks in Athens. We read in Acts 17: "Paul then stood up in the meeting of the Areopagus and said, 'Men of Athens, I see that in every way you are very religious. For as I walked around and looked carefully at your objects of worship, I even found an altar with the inscription: TO AN UNKNOWN GOD. Now what you worship as something unknown, I am going to proclaim to you.'" Paul began where the people to whom he was speaking were. He always had the same Gospel message, but he made that message relevant to people's experience. The story of God's love is relevant to all people. How we present that story is important in reaching people in a meaningful way.
